

EDWARD HUGGINS. 1860.

"The [Hudson's Bay Company] introduced mules in the packing business and in 1860 I drove a fine lot of large mules and common brood mares, a fine American bred stallion and a jackass to British Columbia. I went via the Naches Pass and returned by the Old Snoqualmie Pass for the purpose of ascertaining which was the best pass for driving five or six thousand sheep into British Columbia.
